

## **SOLAS: Container Verified Gross Mass (VGM) Declaration**

The International Maritime Organisation (IMO) has amended the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) to require, as a condition for loading a packed container onto a ship for export, that the container has a verified weight. More informations <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>

The verification of the gross mass VGM has been achieved by the following method:

Method 1	Weighing the packed container using calibrated equipment
Method 2	Weighing all packages and cargo items, including the mass of pallets, dunnage and other securing material to be packed in the container and adding the tare mass of the container to the sum of single masses, using a certified method by the competent authority of the State in which packing of the container was completed.
